## **Organization of National and International Medical Conferences**

During the last forty (40) years, I have with my money and visionary initiative organized five national and international medical conferences. These medical conferences have contributed towards the continuing medical education and enhancement of the intellectual caliber of the physicians. Millions of Americans and citizens of >twenty five (25) countries have received State of the Art healthcare from my relentless efforts. Details of these medical conferences are as follows:

## **Perinatal Care and Neonatal Screening-1978**

An interdisciplinary conference was organized [Clin Chem 1978; 25(7)] at South Macomb Hospital, Warren, MI (now part of Ascension-Michigan).

In subsequent years, I was instrumental with the help of the then Governor of Michigan (Mr. William G. Milliken) in the passing of the legislation in the State of Michigan for the neonatal screening of newborns. Today, neonates are screened for >75 genetic disorders.

For several years the testing for the entire ensemble of genetic disorders in newborns was not available in all the fifty states of America, e.g. South Dakota (due to lack of funds for a highly sophisticated laboratory). I pursued this matter with the three honorable members of U.S. Senate (Edward Kennedy, Barak Obama and Hillary Clinton). Unfortunately Senator Kennedy died and both

Senator Obama and Clinton left the U.S. Senate for their presidential aspirations. Luckily, the U.S. Senate passed a legislation for the availability of all the >75 tests for genetic disorders for all the newborns in America.

Newborn screening was introduced by me in several foreign countries (e.g., Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Bahrain, Egypt), and all the testing was done at the laboratories of the University of Iowa, Iowa City, Iowa.

A book edited by me was launched in 2013 on "Diagnostic Hemoglobinopathy, Laboratory Methods and Case Studies." A chapter was written by me in this book on "Neonatal Screening for Hemoglobinopathies."
